Market Trends

Property values in Seaboard Township have consistently shown upward trends, largely due to the community's commitment to maintaining a high standard of living.

During August 2024, 195 homes were sold in Paulding County; 54% of homes were sold within 30 days, 33% of homes were sold within 30 to 90 days, and 13% of homes were sold over 90 days. Housing prices by bedroom type for August 2024 compared to the previous year: The home price of 2-bedroom homes did not change, 3-bedroom homes increased by 4.7%, 4-bedroom homes increased by 1.2%, and 5+ bedroom homes increased by 3.9%.

Unlikely Neighbors the Urban Deer of Hiram, Georgia
